Important Dates to Remember

Student Information Forms

June 19

All forms on the website must be completed, signed, printed, and postmarked by June 9th.

Arrival

9:00 am-12:00 pm

June 28

Students should arrive Sunday, June 28th, between the hours of 9:00 am and 12:00 pm for check-in to the program and residence hall. Students and parents must report to Litton Reaves Hall for check-in. Parking will be available in lots located next to Harper Hall and Litton Reaves Hall. The student must be moved in by 1:00 pm.

Opening Ceremony

3:00 pm

June 28

Students and parents must attend the Opening Ceremony which will be held in 100 McBryde Hall Sunday, June 28th at 3:00 pm. The program will consist of guest speakers and an overview of the Governor's School. Students should dress in business casual for the event.

Family Weekend

July 11

This is an optional event at the midpoint of the program that is set aside for family members who would like to visit the campus and spend time with the GSA students. No required activities are planned so your son/daughter will be free to spend the entire day with his/her family. If you find this weekend inconvenient or if the distance to Blacksburg is too far, we will have plenty of recreational activities for students whose parents cannot come for the day. If another person will pick up your son/daughter, you must fax or email permission to the Director.

Symposium & Poster Session

12:30 pm

July 24

This event is a presentation of GSA projects exemplifying the result of the learning experienced and effort put forth by students for the duration of the four-weeks. The event will take place Friday, July 24th, beginning at 12:30 pm in Litton Reaves Hall. The approximate time for your son/daughter's group presentation will be set at a later date. We encourage parents, teachers, guardians, and guests to attend this session to support the students in presenting their final product. Parking is available in the lots next to Litton Reaves Hall and Harper Hall, **but parking passes will be REQUIRED**. GSA will not be responsible for parking tickets received. Mission of the GSA

To provide hands-on, cutting-edge, scientific, and academic instruction to future leaders and scientists in developing their understanding of the scope, opportunities, and challenges, through academic and scientific rigor of the broad fields of agriculture, human health, natural resources, and veterinary medicine.

Goals of the GSA

The goals of the Governor's School for Agriculture at Virginia Tech are to:

1. Provide structured educational programs in agriculture, natural resource management, veterinary medicine, environmental systems, and life sciences that will challenge the gifted and talented youth to study and research the scientific nature of agriculture as it relates to and affects environmental sustainability;
2. Provide educational programs designed to increase student understanding of the infrastructure, scope, and implications of Virginia's largest industry, agriculture;
3. Acquaint rising juniors and seniors with professional and scientific education and career opportunities available to them in the agricultural, human health, natural resource, and veterinary medicine sectors;
4. Promote an atmosphere of inquiry and dialogue, with an appreciation for multicultural diversity;
5. Increase understanding of the complexities involved in providing safe, economical, and aesthetically pleasing food, fiber, and shelter.

Curriculum

The curriculum is designed specifically to provide a balanced and diverse curriculum for gifted learners. Emphasis will be placed on developing your son/daughter's appreciation of the broad nature and tremendous scope of agriculture and natural resource systems. The curriculum will include instruction and experiences intended to provide exposure and insight into the real-world challenges involved in feeding, clothing, and housing over six billion people.

The curriculum will consist of core courses, an in-major course, elective courses, an independent group project, career awareness activities, seminars, and extracurricular activities. All courses will consist of mixed classroom instruction with hands-on activities in the laboratory and the field.

Majors

Your son/daughter will request a major based on his/her interest areas. The students will be organized into groups based on their assigned majors. **Please be aware that not all students will receive their first choice of major.** If your child's paperwork is not returned, their major will be assigned by the Director. These groups will be used for scheduling some of their classes, field trips, and an independent group project.

The Governor's School offers the following majors:

- Agricultural Economics
- Agricultural Leadership
- Animal Science
- Plant Science
- Veterinary Medicine

Core courses

The students will attend a core course in each of the six majors. Core and in-major courses should not be confused. Core courses will typically cross several academic disciplines so that any given core course might have close ties to multiple majors.

In-major courses

Once students have been assigned a major, they will attend a specialized course within that major. In-major courses will be intended to carry the students further in their assigned majors and to prepare them for their independent group projects.

Elective courses

Elective courses are designed to explore areas of special interest to students outside the core and major.

Global Seminar

Global Seminar is designed to make students more aware of problems and issues surrounding the field of agriculture. Students will be assigned to cooperative work groups of 5-6 members. It is anticipated that work groups will schedule additional time at their own initiative. The groups will produce the following items as a result of their research: 4-6 page personal reflection report, research poster, brochure, and a 10-15 minute illustrated oral presentation with a powerpoint.

Symposium and Poster Session

At the conclusion of the School, a symposium and poster session will be held to showcase the results of the independent group projects. We plan to conduct the session, during which each student will be encouraged to invite a high school teacher and his or her parents or guardians to campus. The symposium and poster session day will conclude with a Parent-Teacher Appreciation Banquet to recognize the contributions of the parents/guardians and the high school teacher to the lives of the students.

GSA Faculty and Staff

Instructional Faculty

University Faculty Members are selected for participation in the instructional program based on research and academic specialty and on documented instructional excellence. Faculty members in the Virginia Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine as well as life sciences faculty in other colleges at Virginia Tech participate in the Governor's School program as instructors. In addition, teachers of agricultural education in Virginia participate as instructors at the GSA.

Director

The Director has general responsibility for the planning, operation, and evaluation of the School including all matters pertaining to curriculum, housing, meals, safety, and residential life.

Assistant Director

The School's Assistant Director was selected with emphasis on experience in secondary-level teaching in agriculture. The person serves as the primary assistant to the Director. In addition, the assistant director also has supervisory responsibility for the living conditions, recreation, morale, health, and welfare for students attending the Governor's School for Agriculture.

Administrative Assistant

The Administrative Assistant will help in the day to day maintenance of the Governor's School and supervise students as necessary.

Residence Life Director

The Residence Life Director will be available to your son or daughter as a resource at all times. The Residence Life Director's role will be to provide your son or daughter with guidance in terms of career options and continuing educational options.

Governor's School Leaders

Governor's School Leaders are senior-level or graduate students with knowledge in the respective academic disciplines for which they will provide instruction, mentorship, and assistance. Leaders were selected for their academic ability, enthusiasm, leadership, and potential as instructional assistants. Each leader will be assigned to work with a major. They will also be available to your son or daughter as a resource at all times.

Teaching Assistants

Teaching Assistants are the Governor's School Leaders' primary support. The Teaching Assistants will provide instruction, mentorship, and other support as directed by the Governor's School Leader.

Housing Information

Harper Hall has been selected for housing of the 2009 Governor's School. Harper is an air-conditioned, suite-style building, with either two or three rooms sharing a common living room and bathroom. Each suite living room is furnished with a coffee table, sofa, side chair, and rocker. The 4th floor in Harper Hall is also equipped with a kitchenette facility that includes a microwave oven, a stovetop range and oven, refrigerator, and a kitchen sink.

Each room in Harper is carpeted and comes with 2 beds, 2 three-drawer chests, 2 desks, 2 bookcases, 2 chairs, and closet space. Each bedroom will house two students of the same gender. Roommates will be randomly assigned. Females and males will live in the same dormitory; however they will be placed in separate areas of the building and supervised by Governor's School Staff.

Coin-operated laundry facilities are conveniently located in Harper Hall and cost \$1.50 to wash and \$1.25 to dry. Students are advised to bring a drying rack if they prefer not to dry their clothes in a dryer.

Two room keys will be issued at registration, one for the suite and one for the individual room. Students are responsible for keeping track of keys throughout the program. **A \$50 fee will be charged to the student for each lost or stolen key.** Students are also responsible for respecting the property of Virginia Tech and will be charged for damaged or stolen property.

Telephone Access

Students will have telephones to make local calls and receive long-distance calls. They will be able to make long distance calls using a calling card or by dialing other 1-800 numbers upon request to the Residence Life Director. Students will **NOT** have the availability of a voice messaging service. Parents may also telephone the Governor's School Office in the event of an emergency. (See Directory Information)

Students may bring cell phones but they may not be taken to class. Abuse of cell phones during class will result in temporary confiscation.

** The Virginia Department of Education and participating schools pay for all of your student's educational and room and board expenses. However, students will have opportunities to participate in activities such as bowling, going to the movies, and shopping. Former GSA students recommended bringing \$50.00-\$150.00 to participate in these activities.

Security

The campus of Virginia Tech is very safe, however, to reduce the chance of theft please encourage your son/daughter to keep his/her door locked to protect his/her personal valuables.

The GSA is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Objects susceptible to theft include PDAs, laptops, or other easily portable or expensive items.

Virginia Tech police have general responsibility for dormitory security and make routine unscheduled visits around and throughout the public portion of all dorms.

Computer Requirements

The computer access the GSA provides will meet all of the student's academic and personal needs while attending the Governor's School for Agriculture. However, students may find it convenient to have a computer at the GSA if they have that option.

If you and your son/daughter decide to bring a personal computer, the first three bullets need to be addressed in order to access the World Wide Web:

- The Computer needs an Ethernet Card (a.k.a. network adapter, Network Interface Card [NIC]) to access the Internet.
- The NIC needs to run on a 10Base-T network and have an RJ-45 connector in order to connect the computer in the residence hall.
- Students will need an Ethernet cord measuring 20 feet or longer.
- **MODEMS DO NOT WORK in the dorm rooms.**
- Students who choose to bring a computer will benefit if it is equipped with a printer, and CD rewriteable drive.
- Students may also want to bring recordable CDs, and a 128 MB or higher USB memory stick/flash drive.

Please do not bring a wireless router since wireless service is not available to your son/daughter.

Student E-mail

All students enrolled in the GSA will receive Virginia Tech e-mail accounts for their use while attending the school. These accounts will be active on the first night of school and will continue to be active through graduation. These e-mail accounts are intended for use as an educational tool. However, we also encourage you to keep in contact with your child through these e-mail accounts. Students will have time to check their e-mail accounts daily and with their intense courses and schedules e-mail may be the most efficient way to reach them.

Each student will receive instruction on how to set up and access his/her account. Students will also receive instruction on how their GSA accounts are to be used. The University Acceptable Use Guidelines are linked from the GSA and are also available at <http://www.policies.vt.edu/acceptableuse.html>.

Dining Facilities

The dining hall is a traditional, all-you-care-to-eat venue. Faculty and staff will be provided with meals at the same facility as the students. All University dining facilities routinely provide for special dietary needs of students in response to written request. Meals for vegetarians and vegans are available on a daily basis in the dining hall and are clearly labeled. The request for dining accommodations is included on the Student Information form

Meal cards will be issued at registration. Students are responsible for keeping track of their meal cards. **Lost or stolen meal cards will result in a \$5 charge for replacement.** Students are only allowed entrance into the dining hall once during a meal period.

Code of conduct

Attendance

In order to receive a certificate of completion from the Governor's School for Agriculture at Virginia Tech, a participant must be in residence from opening to closing ceremony. Participants are expected to attend all activities set forth by GSA of Virginia Tech. These activities include but are not limited to scheduled classes, meetings, and field trips. Participants are not allowed to leave GSA unless special permission is obtained from an appropriate party. Special permission is granted in cases of emergency only. These guidelines are in place to ensure the participants receive the maximum amount of benefits offered by this program.

Standards of Conduct

The following occurrences result in immediate expulsion from the program:

1. Using or possessing alcoholic beverages, tobacco, or illegal substances of any type.
2. Leaving GSA designated areas without special permission.
3. Possessing or using weapons of any kind.
4. Committing any act of violence.
5. Intentionally damaging or stealing the property of Virginia Tech, GSA, or another.
6. Leaving the residence hall after curfew without permission from the Director.
7. Exhibiting potentially harmful behavior to oneself or others.
8. Bringing a vehicle to campus, riding in a vehicle while not accompanied by parent/guardian, or riding in a vehicle not approved by GSA staff/faculty.
9. Disrespecting faculty, staff, presenters, other students, university employees or others on campus.

Compliance with the following rules are mandatory for all GSA participants:

1. Participants are to be on GSA designated floors in Harper Hall by 9:30 every night unless otherwise stated by GSA Staff.
- 2. Participants will be in and remain in their suites at 10:30 pm until 6:00 am.**
3. Participants are to attend all scheduled activities as set forth by GSA staff. In case of an emergency (i.e. illness, extenuating circumstances), a GSA staff member must be notified immediately.
4. Participants are required to walk in groups (two or more) at all times.
5. Visitors are not permitted in resident rooms or suites at any time unless granted permission by the GSA Director.
6. Compliance with resident hall rules as set forth by the GSA and Virginia Tech officials.
7. Room and suite doors shall be locked when vacant.
8. Participants are not allowed in Staff rooms.

Residence Hall Procedures

1. Male students are not allowed in the female student's living area and vice versa.
2. Quiet hours are set by Virginia Tech residency program and will be respected by all GSA staff and students.** No loud music is to be played or other loud noise created during these hours.
3. Students may not have any guests.
4. Students may not play ball games or throw frisbees or other projectiles in the residence hall.
5. **Pets are not permitted in the residence hall.**
6. **Students must keep rooms and suites tidy for the duration of the school.**
7. Students must also clean rooms and suites completely prior to check out.
8. One suite per night will be responsible for cleaning the common areas.

**Quiet hours are as follows: Sunday-Thursday 7:00 pm-10:00 am
Friday-Saturday 11:30 pm-11:00 am

Please note: The Governor's School reserves the right to have authorized staff enter any student's room without notice if reasonable cause suggests that regulations are being violated.

Violation of Rules

For minor rule violations, the following steps will be taken:

- 1st Offense:** Conference with student and Governor School Leader (GSL).
- 2nd Offense:** Conference with student, GSL, and Assistant Director/Director.
- 3rd Offense:** Conference call with student, GSL, Assistant Director/Director, and student's parent/guardian.
- 4th Offense:** Expulsion from the school.

In case of severe violations, some steps may be omitted.

Dress

- **Clothing should fit, be neat and clean, and conform to standards of safety, good taste, and decency.**
- Opening Ceremony: Business Casual (Khakis, slacks, polo shirts, button down shirts, skirts, blouses)
- College Night, Symposium, graduation, banquet, some evening programs: Professional Dress (Nice pants, shirts, ties, dresses, blouses, and skirts.)
- Class, field trips, recreation: Long and short sleeve shirts, long pants, shorts, comfortable shoes, footwear suitable for hiking. Closed toe shoes and long pants may be required for some activities. Old clothes and shoes for getting wet and muddy are also necessary.
- Name Tags will be provided and must be worn at all times unless otherwise stated by the GSA staff. **Name tags will be worn above the waist and be clearly visible.**

The following dress/attire, for example, **is unacceptable**; please refrain from bringing these items:

- Clothing with language or images that are vulgar, discriminatory, or obscene or clothing that promotes illegal or violent conduct, such as the unlawful use of weapons, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or drug paraphernalia.
- Clothing that exposes cleavage, the midriff, or undergarments, or that is otherwise sexually provocative.
- Sagging or low-cut pants, low-cut necklines that show cleavage, tube tops, halter tops, spaghetti straps, backless blouses or blouses with only ties in the back and clothing constructed of see-through materials.
- Bathing suits are only allowed if in the appropriate setting.

Please note:

Virginia Tech has a diverse population; keep this in mind when choosing attire and avoid controversial clothing and accessories.

The Governor's School reserves the right to require students to return to their room to change clothing if deemed inappropriate before participating in further activities.

Medical Protocol

Virginia Tech maintains a University Clinic, staffed by medical professionals. Medical needs exceeding the capability of the Clinic personnel will be referred to the Montgomery Regional Hospital, which is a modern, comprehensive medical facility located less than 5 miles from campus. A staff member will always accompany your child to the doctor. There are forms included on the website for you to sign to allow your child to obtain emergency treatment until you are contacted. The web site for Virginia Tech Health Services is: <http://www.healthcenter.vt.edu/>.

The Governor's School carries an accident and sickness insurance policy that may cover a small amount of the initial cost of any medical event that occurs with your child during the Governor's School. If the cost of treatment exceeds the maximum coverage, the parent/legal guardian will be billed directly, and will be responsible for the remaining difference. Pre-existing conditions are not covered under the Governor's School's policy. **Please disclose all medical information for the safety of your child.**

Many insurance providers require a referral in order to authorize payment for medical care. If your insurance provider requires a referral you will need to make the necessary arrangements with your primary care physician. Some medically related expenses and medications are not covered by insurance (e.g. co-payments for a physician's visit, replacing eyeglasses/contacts, orthodontic repair, prescriptions). **Please discuss how to cover these unpredictable expenses with your son/daughter.**

Special Needs and Special Diets

The Governor's School intends to create an inclusive and welcoming community for all students. Reasonable accommodations will be provided for any student with special needs or circumstances. On the website (<http://www.gsa.vt.edu>), the Student Information Sheet has a section for you to fill out detailing any special needs of your son or daughter. Included on the form is room for any details about special dietary needs as well.

Worship Services

If your son/daughter is interested in attending a religious service during his/her stay at the school, we ask that you would make note of the place of worship on the scholar survey. The GSA office will contact you if arrangements need to be made for vehicular transportation. State of Virginia regulations prohibit the Governor's School from using state vehicles to transport students to and from religious services. Students will be escorted by a GSA staff member to off-campus services within walking distance. We have listed some of the denominations available in the area.
